

Treasurer's Report

Statement of Operations - We are running a \$5.8k deficit YTD. We have generated \$89.9k in General income compared to \$113.1k budgeted (Feb giving was comparable to Feb of last year giving, but we are down from last year's YTD giving). However, General expenses were \$97.3k YTD less than our YTD budget of \$113.7k, mainly due to less than budgeted Jan payroll expense with Pr Walter's delayed start and a Feb utility refund for solar panel usage.

Balance Sheet & Cash Flow - Cash has decreased by \$19.1 YTD, primarily driven by the use of dedicated funds. The total of cash and accounts receivable is \$130.4k. Funds allocated to dedicated accounts is \$170.6k.

Our Savior's Lutheran Church 75th Anniversary Legacy Fund Update

In 2022, The 75th Anniversary Team launched The Our Savior's Lutheran Church 75th Anniversary Legacy Fund Campaign.

The Project: Care for Our Members – Accessibility Improvements Care for Creation & Energy Savings – Window Replacement Care for our Worship Experience – Sanctuary Enhancements From October 2022 to October 2023, we organized and implemented seven congregational and community-wide events to lift up and celebrate Our Savior's 75 years of being a caring community of faith.

Thank you for your generous support of this project!

Campaign Goal: \$280,000 Our goal in 2024 is to raise \$140,000 Donations to Date: \$151,600 Funds Used to Date: \$51,426

Project Status:

- The window replacement project is near completion. Windows have been replaced in the offices, conference room, nursery and room 117. Window coverings and the replacement of windows in room 111 are in progress.
- The handicap accessible restroom project has been designed. Bids are being received for remodeling the restrooms in the office area to be unisex and handicap accessible. This portion of the legacy project should be completed in the next few months.
- Sanctuary enhancements are in discussion and will be implemented in phases.

Our Savior's Cares for Creation

Our Savior's Purpose Statement is "Created for Relationship with God, all people everywhere and creation itself." Members of OSLC have been living that statement when it comes to the environment and the challenges of climate change:

- Changing light bulbs has saved over \$6,000 per year. Light bulbs in the building were changed to LED in the spring of 2020. This has reduced electrical consumption by approximately 60,000 kilowatt-hours per year.
- Solar array has saved another \$6,000 per year. A solar array was installed on the roof of the building with production starting in October 2021. The array has produced 136,000 kilowatt-hours of electricity since it started. This has saved 211,000 pounds of carbon dioxide emissions from going into the atmosphere. That's the equivalent of planting 1600 trees
- Window Replacement. Recently, old, rotted, and drafty windows have been replaced as part of the 75th Anniversary Legacy Project. The new windows provide energy efficiency and occupant comfort.
- Salt Reduction. Efforts are being made to reduce the use of salt for ice melting on the property during the winter. Salt pollution eventually finds its way into our waterways and water supply. Once salt is in the environment it is there to stay.

- Conversations. Kristen Genet has recently been leading a study called Conservation Conversations using the book "All We Can Save" as a basis for discussion. Actions we can take as individuals to address climate change have been outcomes from this study. More is to come.
- **Adult Education.** On December 17, 2023, Dr. Luther Dale offered a thought-provoking presentation "Glad, Sad and Mad: Living with Climate Change".
- HVAC Contractor. The contractor providing heating, ventilation and air conditioning services for OSLC was recently changed. The new contractor will be evaluating all of the building systems to identify areas where the building could be operated more efficiently resulting in reduced energy costs.
- Raingarden/Pollinator Habitat. In response to a soil erosion problem on the north side of the building, a rain garden was planted in 2008 by Our Savior's Yarden Group using 600 deep-rooted native plants in a bermed area to control the erosion, retain the water and allow it to percolate into the soil. These flowering native plants have provided the added benefits of providing habitat for pollinators and birds while filtering the water. This low maintenance area requires no mowing, which also reduces pollution.
