JOHN 1:1-18
In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it. There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father’s only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, “This was he of whom I said, ‘He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.’”) From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is the only Son, himself God, who is close to the Father’s heart, who has made him known.

Treasurer's Report

Financial Statement - Year to date we have received \$508k against our budgeted revenue of \$616.7k Our YTD Expenses are \$624.2k compared to a budget of \$630.2k This puts us at a negative \$116k year to date. However, because of the Employee Retention Credit of \$34,038, we are now at a negative \$81k.

Balance Sheet & Cash Flow - The total of cash and accounts receivable is \$184.5k. Funds allocated to dedicated accounts is \$170.1k. We have had to draw from our savings over the last 2 months to pay our bills and dedicated accounts are at risk.

The Congregation Council is actively evaluating ministry plans and will engage the congregation in decision making regarding putting forth a balanced budget for 2026.

Studies show that 60-80% of those who don't attend church would attend worship if invited to attend worship with someone they knew. Additionally, Christmas is a time when more people are open to an invitation than other times throughout the year.
