CALL TO WORSHIP

P When we struggle in life, what are the words of God that give us courage?

GATHERING SONG: God Himself Is Present

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P "The earth was corrupt in God's sight, and the earth was filled with violence." There is goodness in people and in the world, but what God saw long ago, God certainly sees today. Let us take a moment in silence to consider the vast difference between ideal and reality concerning how God intends that we live with one another and God's good creation.

Silence

P God who calls us to yourself,

C you tell us not to bow down to and worship other gods. In so many ways, however, we give our allegiance not to you, our Creator, but to people and things. We even demand that others bend the knee to us. Forgive us, O God, and help us to find our way back to you.

P God who calls us into fellowship with sisters and brothers,

C you tell us to love one another as we love ourselves. Yet we too often find ourselves not loving one another, but competing with, dominating, or ignoring your children. Forgive us, O God, and save us from selfishness as you turn us in love toward our neighbor.

P God who calls us to love the earth as you do,

C you tell us to be good and faithful stewards of your creation, that the earth may live in peace and your people may flourish. We confess that it is our tendency to take and use whatever we want, giving little thought to how our avarice and inattention will affect your good creation, your children, and future generations. Forgive us, O God, and for the sake of your creation, help us to be good and kind and thoughtful stewards.

P Even in the depth of our sin, God established an everlasting covenant with us and with creation itself. God sent Jesus into this world to reestablish and renew that covenant. So, as a called and ordained minister of our Lord Jesus Christ, and in obedience to his command and by his authority, I declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sin, and I invite you to turn to God, love one another, and care for God's good creation. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Genesis 39:1-23

Now Joseph was taken down to Egypt, and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the guard, an Egyptian, bought him from the Ishmaelites who had brought him down there. The Lord was with Joseph, and he became a successful man; he was in the house of his Egyptian master. His master saw that the Lord was with him, and that the Lord caused all that he did to prosper in his hands. So Joseph found favor in his sight and attended him; he made him overseer of his house and put him in charge of all that he had. From the time that he made him overseer in his house and over all that he had, the Lord blessed the Egyptian's house for Joseph's sake; the blessing of the Lord was on all that he had, in house and field. So he left all that he had in Joseph's charge; and, with him there, he had no concern for anything but the food that he ate. Now Joseph was handsome and good-looking.

And after a time his master's wife cast her eyes on Joseph and said, "Lie with me." But he refused and said to his master's wife, "Look, with me here, my master has no concern about anything in the house, and he has put everything that he has in my hand. He is not greater in this house than I am, nor has he kept back anything from me except yourself, because you are his wife. How then could I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?" And although she spoke to Joseph day after day, he would not consent to lie beside her or to be with her. One day, however, when he went into the house to do his work, and while no one else was in the house, she caught hold of his garment, saying, "Lie with me!" But he left his garment in her hand, and fled and ran outside.

When she saw that he had left his garment in her hand and had fled outside, she called out to the members of her household and said to them, "See, my husband has brought among us a Hebrew to insult us! He came in to me to lie with me, and I cried out with a loud voice;

and when he heard me raise my voice and cry out, he left his garment beside me, and fled outside." Then she kept his garment by her until his master came home, and she told him the same story, saying, "The Hebrew servant, whom you have brought among us, came in to me to insult me; but as soon as I raised my voice and cried out, he left his garment beside me, and fled outside."

When his master heard the words that his wife spoke to him, saying, "This is the way your servant treated me," he became enraged. And Joseph's master took him and put him into the prison, the place where the king's prisoners were confined; he remained there in prison. But the Lord was with Joseph and showed him steadfast love; he gave him favor in the sight of the chief jailer. The chief jailer committed to Joseph's care all the prisoners who were in the prison, and whatever was done there, he was the one who did it. The chief jailer paid no heed to anything that was in Joseph's care, because the Lord was with him; and whatever he did, the Lord made it prosper.
